Reading and approval of minutes from April 8, 2021

- -No changes
- -Motion to approve: Dr. Rocky Lemus; 2nd- Dr. Darrell Sparks

Standing Committee Reports:

Office of the Vice President: Dr. Keith Coble

- -Dr. Coble is Interim Director for MAFES
- -Dean/Director searches are underway for CALS/MAFES and CFW/FWRC; hope to finish this fall; will move towards filling interim department head positions after
- -Approximately 55% of students are vaccinated and have seen increases in the % of students reporting they are vaccinated
- -VP's Conference Room has been remodeled
- -Dr. Ashley Brown has been named Associate Vice-President for DAFVM; Dr. Darrell Sparks is now interim Head for the State Chemical Lab
- -IHL voted not to mandate vaccinations with the exception of some clinical positions
- -Damage from Hurricane Ida was minimal

- -Veterinary Medicine celebrated their 40th Anniversary this week
- -The state economy is looking good; potential for federal funding passed down to the state via the infrastructure bill; departments were asked to put together lists of potential projects
- -VP's are discussing what the future of teleworking at MSU should look like
- -MSU is going through a branding exercise with a branding firm

Questions-Dr. Lemus asked about the mixed message that Covid-19 protocols at football games sends? Dr. Coble responded that IHL voted with a clear majority.

Interim Dean, CALS: Dr. Scott Willard

- -Dr. Willard has received calls from faculty that support and oppose vaccinations
- -CALS undergraduate is down slightly while graduate enrollment is up slightly
- -15 new faculty and 6 new post-docs
- -College teaching minor will be available in the spring
- -MS program in Public Health and Nutrition will begin next fall
- -Provost Shaw requested that the Associate Dean's Council begin discussions about Instructional Professor/Professor of Practice positions
- -Provost is supporting dual enrollment with high schools since enrollment in grades 9-12 will be declining 3-4% and competition for those students will increase
- -Transformational change: Data science and precision ag will be at the forefront for agriculture

Interim Dean, CFR & FWRC: Dr. Wes Burger

- -CFR enrollment was down slightly (from returning students)
- -Face to face instruction is going well
- -At the request of Provost Shaw, Dr. Burger is chairing a Faculty Development Task
 Force since many new faculty don't have formal teaching experience; there is a
 new academy with CTL; looking at the approach to providing continuous
 engagement for pre-tenure faculty and equipping new faculty for success
- -Contracts and grants office has a vacant position that they hope to have refilled by October
- -SRI grant RFP will be rolling out tomorrow;

Extension Service: Dr. Gary Jackson

- -Thankful for the leadership of Dr. David Buys and other Extension professionals who established a lot of the safety guidelines for MSU COVID response from the start
- -Dr. Jackson is chairing the National Broadband committee in the national ECOP group
- -Completed program planning and looking for economic, environmental, and social impact statements

- -Never completely rebounded from FY16-18 budget cuts but were able to reallocate funding and are on our way back to filling to some of our positions; currently searching for 6 faculty with Extension appointments and 2 more coming soon; looking to hire 16 new Extension agents (30 county agents only have one agent and should have a minimum of 2).
- -9.9% budget increase in Extension budget split between faculty raises and operations (technology, positions, etc.); faculty salary increases are the #1 priority at this point
- -Faculty have been very productive and
- -Annual conference award nomination packets coming out soon to nominate your colleagues for outstanding Extension work

Holland Faculty Senate: Dr. Amanda Stone

- -Holland Faculty Senate meets tomorrow
- -Two Covid related resolutions will be discussed

DAFVM Executive Council: Dr. Robert Grala

-Dr. Coble presented his vision for DAFVM; he encourages engagement with stakeholders as well as cross-college collaborations

Extension Advisory Council: Dr. Robert Grala

- -Recent programming has focused on Covid, hurricane response, and health
- -Scholarship of Extension and the importance of informal teaching continue to be emphasized
- -The impact of broadband internet access and quality on programming is a concern

Faculty Housing Appeals Committee: Dr. Robert Grala

- -One request for an extension for faculty housing was approved
- -Two appeals are in process
