CHAMPION OF MS AGRICULTURE

At the age of 15, James R. “Jimmie Dick” Carter began his career as a farmer. His high school principal allowed him to plan his classes in the morning so he could farm in the afternoon. Carter and his family continue to farm diversified crops on 7,000 acres in Sharkey County. A 1950 MSU graduate, Carter and his family operate as Carter Brothers Farm. They have been in the agriculture business for over 70 years. Carter has repeatedly been recognized for his agricultural accomplishments including Mississippi Farmer of the Year, Mississippi Farm Bureau Vice President, Delta Council President, and MSU’s National Alumnus of the Year. The MSU Division of Agriculture, Forestry and Veterinary Medicine and MS Farm Bureau honor Mr. Carter as a champion of Mississippi agriculture.
























